Welcome to this service

From earliest times Christians have gathered through the night of Easter to recall the story of God's saving work, from creation through to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. However, the Easter Liturgy is not merely a presentation of God's work. It is also a real experience of new life for the worshipper; a passing from darkness to light which offers hope to all the faithful. It is important that the preparation be prayerful and thorough.

The Easter Vigil marks the end of the emptiness of Holy Saturday and leads into the celebration of Christ's resurrection. The singing of the Exsultet, the ancient hymn of triumph and rejoicing, links this night of our Christian redemption to the Passover night of Israel's redemption out of Egypt. Christian baptism is a participation in the death and resurrection of Christ, a dying to sin in order to be reborn in him, and the Easter Vigil was from early Christian times a preferred occasion for baptism. It is fittingly a time when those who are already Christians may repeat with renewed commitment the promises of their own baptism, and strengthen their sense of incorporation into the royal and priestly ministry of the whole people of God. The Easter Gospel is proclaimed with all the joy and splendour that the church can find.

The Easter Eucharist follows immediately on the Vigil. All the resources of the church - music, flowers, bells, colours, incense, water - are used to celebrate Christ's resurrection. The 'Alleluia', silent throughout Lent, returns.

The President is The Dean, the Very Revd, John Dobson DL.

The Preacher is The Very Revd Jane Hedges, former Dean of Norwich.

The service is sung by the Full Choral Foundation and the Mass setting is the *Little Organ Mass* by Franz Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) with the Gloria taken from the *Missa brevis* by Jonathan Dove. (b. 1959).

Words of welcome are given by The Dean.

The service begins around the Easter fire on the cathedral forecourt. The congregation is invited to join the clergy around the fire, or to remain in their places turning to face the west door.

The Service of Light

The Marking of the Easter Candle

President	Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord.
	We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.
President	Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light, set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
All	Amen.

After the blessing of the new fire the president marks the Easter candle by tracing the cross, then the Greek letters Alpha and Omega above and below the cross respectively, and the numerals 2024 between the arms of the cross.

President	Christ yesterday and today,
	the beginning and the end,
	Alpha and Omega,
	all time belongs to him, and all ages;
	to him be glory and power,
	through every age and for ever.

Five incense grains are placed in the candle to represent the wounds of Christ.

PresidentBy his holy and glorious wounds
may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.AllAmen.

The Easter Candle is lit.

President May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The deacon bearing the candle enters the Cathedral, followed by the other ministers, pausing just inside the entrance. The deacon bearing the candle raises it and the following is sung.

AllThe Light of Christ.AllThanks be to God.

The procession moves further into the cathedral and pauses a second time. The candle is raised again. The following is sung on a higher note:

AllThe Light of Christ.AllThanks be to God.

The procession continues and pauses once more in front of the nave altar. The candle is raised again. The following is sung on an even higher note:

AllThe Light of Christ.AllThanks be to God.

The Easter candle is placed in the stand and is censed - a pillar of fire in a pillar of cloud. The light is now passed to the people by the acolytes and clergy. Please help spread the light quickly by lighting your neighbour's candle. Please remain standing.

The Exsultet

This is sung to the 4th century plainsong, written for this night by St Ambrose.

Cantor Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! O Universe, dance around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the victorious trumpet of salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation Radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King!

Christ has conquered!

Now his life and glory fill you! Darkness vanishes for ever!

	Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you! Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.
President <i>All</i>	The Lord be with you and also with you.
President <i>All</i>	Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.
President <i>All</i>	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.
President All	It is right and good that with hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who has saved us by his death, paid the price of Adam's sin, and reconciled us once again to you. Glory to you for ever.
President All	For this is the Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb of God, is slain whose blood consecrates the homes of all the faithful. Glory to you for ever.
President All	This is the night when you first saved our ancestors, freeing Israel from her slavery and leading her safely through the sea. Glory to you for ever.
President <i>All</i>	This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell, broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave. Glory to you for ever.
President <i>All</i>	This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin, restored to grace and holiness, and share the victory of Christ. Glory to you for ever.
President <i>All</i>	This is the night that gave us back what we had lost; beyond our deepest dreams you made even our sin a happy fault. Glory to you for ever.

President <i>All</i>	Most blessed of all nights! Evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy. Glory to you for ever.
President <i>All</i>	Night truly blessed when hatred is cast out, peace and justice find a home, and heaven is joined to earth and all creation reconciled to you. Glory to you for ever.
President	Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Grant that this Easter Candle may make our darkness light.
All	For Christ the morning star has risen in glory; Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us! Christ sheds his peaceful light on the world! Christ lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

The Vigil

Introduction

President As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer; and let us pray that, through this Easter celebration, God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun.

Please sit.

Old Testament Readings

A reading from the Book of Exodus.

As Pharaoh drew near, the Israelites looked back, and there were the Egyptians advancing on them. In great fear the Israelites cried out to the Lord. But Moses said to the people, 'Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again.' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground.' Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. At the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; so the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses. Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord.

New Testament Reading

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans.

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

	Therefore I ask:
All	Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? I reject them.
President	Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?
<i>All</i>	I renounce them.
President	Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?
<i>All</i>	I repent of them.
President	Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?
<i>All</i>	I turn to Christ.
President	Do you submit to Christ as Lord?
<i>All</i>	I submit to Christ.
President	Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?
<i>All</i>	I come to Christ.

Prayer over the Water

Water is poured into the font which is censed, the president.

President <i>All</i>	Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.
President <i>All</i>	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.
President <i>All</i>	Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ was baptised in the river Jordan, we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us. Saving God, give us life.

The Easter Candle is lowered into the water.

President	We thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea
	you led your people out of slavery
	to freedom in the Promised Land.
A//	Saving God, give us life.

The Easter Candle is lowered into the water a second time.

President	We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son,
	and raised him to life in triumph.
All	Saving God, give us life.

The Easter Candle is lowered into the water a final time.

President All	Bless this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Saving God, give us life.
President <i>All</i>	Send your Holy Spirit upon them, bring them to new birth in the household of faith and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life; for all might, majesty, authority and power are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

Profession of Faith

President	Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess the faith of the Church.
All	Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
President <i>All</i>	Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
President <i>All</i>	Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

	On the night before he died he had supper with his friends, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.
	When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.
	So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.
