During this service, the children will be invited to distribute daffodils to their mothers and other adults. If you would like to leave your daffodils in memory of your own mother or other carer who has died, you are invited, after the service, to place the flowers on the High Altar. If you write their name on the list you will find there, the clergy will pray for them at Monday morning prayer.
