A NOTE FROM THE DEAN



Lent: Journeying Together as the Body of Christ

Journeying Together is the theme we have chosen for Lent this year. I do hope you will choose in some way to journey through Lent together with us. The theme reminds us that we are not members of Christ's Church as isolated individuals, separated one from another. Rather, we are part of the Body of Christ (an image used to great effect by St. Paul), members together of the one community of faith.

This finds tangible expression when we gather together within the cathedral for worship. We know well, of course, that we never get everyone together in the same place at the same time – and that is within the one church community which is Ripon Cathedral. We have now got used to welcoming those who worship with us online, and we know that there are many different congregations through the week, and people who receive communion in fellowship with us at home.

The Church has always known that, as the 'mystical body' of Christ, part of its reality is a mystery, one that by the working of the Holy Spirit holds its members together in a unity which transcends time and space. We are interdependent upon, and interrelated to, each other.

So, as we journey through Lent, we can remind ourselves of this truth and help to strengthen it as a reality in our own lives, by choosing a Lenten discipline which not only feeds and refreshes us as individuals, but which binds us together. Simply by knowing that we are all united in keeping Lent in a meaningful way, we are strengthening the bonds that bind us.

Some of us will come together for certain groups or acts of worship. For others of us, the routine of life will make this impossible beyond a weekly act of worship. But by reading the same book as others, or using the Church of England booklet, 'Living Hope', each day through Lent (there is also a children's edition of this – both are available from the cathedral), or by attempting to be more disciplined in our daily prayers with the help of the Cathedral Prayer Diary, we are all becoming more united one with another and, which gets to the heart and hope of things, we become more united with God.

Please, do ensure you take a Lent 2025 leaflet from the cathedral, or see it on our website, and consider taking advantage of at least one of the things being offered or recommended through Ripon Cathedral this Lent.

Lent: Giving in Thanksgiving

Another theme for us this Lent at Ripon Cathedral is 'Giving in Thanksgiving'. This is the title of our planned giving campaign. In being asked to contribute faithfully and regularly to the cathedral's finances, we are being reminded that all our giving to God through the cathedral is an expression of gratitude and an acknowledgment that all we are and all we need for life come as gifts from God.

Some of our 'giving in thanksgiving' takes the form of being generous with our time and skills – for this I am extremely grateful. Our stewardship campaign, however, is focussing on our financial support. We have produced a campaign booklet which gives information about the cathedral's finances and the ways in which we can give regularly. This is packaged with a leaflet about the Parish Giving Scheme and a response form. There should be a pack for everyone who already gives regularly and everyone on the Electoral Roll. Please, if you have not received a pack and would like one, do ask for one or see the website for information.

It is simply the case that without the generous support of many people – in time, skills and money – the cathedral would not be able to offer its extensive and growing ministry to the city, region and diocese. The stewardship campaign booklet notes a few highlights, a small number of the many ways in which our vision strategy, 'Growing God's Kingdom', is bearing fruit. The Chapter and I are extremely grateful for all the support that people so freely give, often self-sacrificially.

It goes without saying that we do not 'tell' people how much they should be giving financially, that is between each one of us and God. The campaign simply asks each one of us to see that our giving is part of our discipleship, and to consider whether we could pledge to give a certain amount on a regular basis, and to decide how much that should be.

If you would like to chat with someone about this for more information, there are three lay members of the Church Growth Committee who are willing to make themselves available. Details are in the campaign booklet or can be obtained from the Cathedral Office.

We have chosen Lent for this renewal campaign as this is a season for spiritual reflection and renewal. We are asking people, if possible, to respond by Sunday, 6^{th} April.

Withdrawal of Ripon Cathedral's planning application for an annex

You are probably already aware that we have decided to withdraw our planning application. Here is the statement which I issued on 14th February.

The Chapter of Ripon Cathedral has this week taken the decision to withdraw the current planning application for its proposed annex on the north side of the cathedral.

While the need for the facilities which the proposed new building would deliver grows ever more urgent, we believe, as we always have, that our development must be part of a wider agreed plan for the city. This includes creating a 'Cathedral Quarter', which would deliver wider benefits to the city and county.

As a result, central to the development of our plans for the annex has been a belief that we were working within the Neighbourhood Plan (adopted after a local referendum) to create that Cathedral Quarter. However, we were saddened that Ripon City Council did not support the proposed annex in its December meeting, despite the many eloquent arguments placed before them and the amendments that had been made to retain the beech tree. In addition, we continue to be asked for ever more proof of viability and justification within the planning system.

The debate within the city has been challenging and difficult for everyone, but especially for cathedral staff and supporters. The intention in withdrawing the current application is to allow the further development and amendment of our plans to be discussed constructively and positively – balancing the many complex constraints and opportunities.

Despite comments to the contrary, the financial sustainability of Ripon Cathedral cannot be taken for granted – and this has been highlighted recently by the current situation of some other cathedrals in England.

With this in mind, we remain steadfast in our commitment to the vision for Ripon Cathedral. With growing numbers of worshippers, visitors, pilgrims, and concertgoers, along with our flourishing choir, the provision of essential facilities (including toilets) for all those who use the cathedral remains an urgent priority. We are also dedicated to protecting the fabric of the cathedral for future generations, some of which has been in continuous use for over 1,350 years and is currently at risk from its inappropriate use for essential storage.

We want to clarify that all costs for developing the proposals, and amending them to respond to the feedback received, have been covered by fundraising. I want to pay tribute to the ongoing generous support of donors and funders, along with the efforts of all who support this ongoing venture.

The whole Chapter joins me in thanking staff, volunteers and all in the wider cathedral community for continuing to achieve so much while battling with the inadequate facilities.

We now look to work constructively with North Yorkshire Council and Ripon City Council on how the essential needs of the cathedral can be met and will be asking them to share their vision for how the Cathedral Quarter will be developed.

Since then, I have received many supportive letters, cards and emails, encouraging the Chapter to press on with determination. Chapter is aware that as the cathedral continues to flourish, progress needs to be made with greater urgency. We have already invited Ripon City Council members to join us for lunch at one of our meetings, and to share with us their vision for Ripon as a cathedral city and for the cathedral quarter which was proposed in their own city plan.

Chapter also realizes that it will be important for us to be in constructive conversation with North Yorkshire Council, the local planning authority. NYC is a new authority and it will be important for us to establish how it understands the significance of the cathedral for both Ripon and the region.

Welcoming a new Canon Pastor

We very much look forward to welcoming our new Canon Pastor, the Revd Wendy Dalrymple. Wendy is currently serving as Precentor, Residentiary Canon Designate and Head of Worship and Events at Canterbury Cathedral.

She will be installed on Sunday 6th April at 3.30pm in a service which will also see the installations of the new Archdeacon of Richmond & Craven, Canon James Theodosius, and a new Honorary Canon, the Revd Dr Sue McWhinney. Please, do join us for what will be a great celebration.

And do, please, pray for Wendy and her husband, Chris, as they prepare for their move back to Yorkshire.

NEWS FROM THE CANON PRECENTOR

The essential work of the church is to pray and to teach people how to pray. Many people tend to use prayer as a last resort, but at Ripon Cathedral it could be said to be our first line of defence. So, we pray 'formally' at least three times with Morning and Evening Prayer and a service of Holy Communion.

Being a Cathedral we rejoice in a choral foundation with an excellent choir who accompany and undergird our praying with glorious music from across the centuries at least six times a week

Recently I have encountered two or three folk who have said they love to come to Evensong for space for themselves. In a sense the chance, at the end of the day to step aside and have space for themselves – almost like another ancient tradition of meditating or reflecting on the day that is past. Perhaps Lent might be a time for you to step aside, towards the end of the working day and take time for yourself in Evensong where you can pray, or be supported by the prayers of others.

As we approach Lent and especially Holy Week and easter, there are many opportunities to journey with us through those momentous events of the first Holy Week. You will find details of the services and activities we are running elsewhere in this newsletter.

Please continue to pray for the music staff and all in the choir that they may remain engaged and resilient as we journey towards Lent and Easter.

Confirmation 2025

We will soon be starting to prepare those, who are interested in developing their faith for Confirmation.

In the Church of England, Confirmation is a special church service in which a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptized. If you were baptized at a christening when you were a child, your parents and godparents made these promises on your behalf. As a young person or adult, you may be ready to affirm these promises for yourself and commit your life to following Jesus Christ. At a confirmation service, you make these promises for yourself. Your friends and family as well as the local Christian community will be there to promise to support and pray for you.


Significantly, more and more adults are approaching the Church as adults to explore issues of faith, having never been baptised. 

The YMCA Sleep Easy takes place in the Dean's Garden at the Cathedral on **Friday 25**th **April** to raise money for the Ripon YMCA. Canon Matthew is sleeping out with the fundraisers and asks everyone in the Cathedral community to sponsor him. Ripon YMCA is one of the Cathedral C3 Partners. We them because youth homelessness is often hidden, and although some people do sleep rough on the streets, many with no fixed home will find themselves on a friend's floor, sofa or in a car. In the past few years Ripon YMCA have worked with many young adults who have slept in tents, sheds, on kitchen floors, on sofas, airbeds or outdoors. The main reason young people become homeless is due to relationships with family or a partner breaking down. Many have mental health issues and suffer low mood and lack of motivation. 





Christingle

With some of our super volunteers we went into Ripon Cathedral Primary School and helped all 210(ish) children make Christingles. We then celebrated together Christ's light in the world at a special service led by Canon Matthew.

Cathedral Club

We've had lots of fun this half-term at our Cathedral Primary after-school club. We've thought about how God started with a blank page at the beginning of creation; how we can have moments of silence to hear God's voice (and then made our favourite quiet places out of plasticine!); we've talked about the armour of God and made weebles; we heard how God knows all about us (and still loves us!); and we finished with making holding crosses, to remind us that every bit of us and creation is held together by God.





Half-term activity morning

The children made wonderful maps and beautiful lanterns.

Canon Matthew was incredibly helpful serving refreshments keeping everyone happy.

Connect with Nature in Lent around the Beautiful Setting of our Cathedral

As the days lengthen, we all want to be outside.

We are lucky in Ripon to be able to walk beside three rivers – the Skell, the Laver and the Ure, even at dusk in February.





- Don't forget to enjoy a walk through the Cathedral churchyard with its swathe of pink cyclamen on the south side which leads down to the River Skell. They are spreading every year.
- Make your way to the Skell and enjoy a walk along the river.
- Don't miss the waves of snowdrops in the Conservation Area, which are spectacular this year.
- They have benefitted from the scarifying done by Open Country, a Harrogate charity in August 2024.
- Do keep your eyes open for the cowslips and violets, which will follow in March.





FIRST REPORT ON CHURCH OF ENGLAND'S PROGRESS TO NZC 2030 PUBLISHED LATE 2024.

Commenting on the Report, **the Bishop of Norwich, the Rt Revd Graham Usher**, who leads on the environment, said that the ultimate goal was "to respond to the climate crisis to help safeguard God's creation and achieve a just world. Every environmental action we take, from installing solar panels to encouraging wildlife in our churchyards, is a step towards caring for God's planet, nature and people. It also means cheaper bills and makes our buildings more sustainable."

Julian Atkins, net-zero programme director, said: "Churches, cathedrals, and schools are already making great progress in reducing their carbon emissions, and many have found that making small changes can make a big difference. We hope the report will encourage and inspire readers to see that achieving net-zero carbon is possible."

Pub William Collins 2024 Hardback £22


I agree with Claudia Winkleman's review of this book: 'Utterly brilliant. We all need to read this book.'

Patrick Grant writes from experience, with his career in the clothing industry spanning 20 years. Whilst he is well known as a judge on the BBC's Great British Sewing Bee, few people know he has a degree in Materials Science and Engineering. He is also an ambassador for HRH King Charles III's charity 'Future Textiles', an organisation working to educate people and sustain craft skills in the UK's textile industry.

This book really is a must if you care about the survival

of our clothing industry, the cohesion of our communities, and the protection of our environment. But don't let this get you down – it is an uplifting and inspirational read about how we can make a difference.

Patrick advises us how we can take informed decisions about what we buy; how we can safeguard the wellbeing of those creating garments and goods. Ultimately, we can play our part as wise stewards of the natural resources of our land and also keep for posterity skills in our local communities to enrich the lives of all.



The last words go to Patrick himself, quoting from the last paragraph of this book: 'Having less but better would be a path to a healthier, more equal society, a source of hope for a better future for the many people of all ages living in what we call our post-industrial communities. Living with fewer, better things is an act of goodness and kindness to people and the planet, and it would make us all happier.'

The book 'Less' not only calls us to face up to the challenges of the fashion industry, but also presents us with solutions for a better future.

BUY NOW! The Shopping Conspiracy – a film on Netflix As consumers we have the power to help restore our planet by reducing our consumption. This British film exposes the methods used by companies and advertising agencies to convince us to buy things we don't need for our basic happiness in life. It is challenging to watch because it is a subversive documentary. It reveals the tricks that big brands use to keep us, their customers, consumingand the real impact that this over-consumption has on our lives and on our world.



Cut consumption – remember the 5R's - Refuse – Reduce – Repair – Re-use – Recycle REALITY CHECK ABOUT CLIMATE CHANGE

As most of you know, 2024 was the hottest year on record. The target of 1.5° above pre-industrial levels, was broken for the first time. In addition, the President of the USA has withdrawn from the 2016 Paris Agreement and is discouraging a Green Transition to a more sustainable and just world.

But many people have experienced an eco-conversion over recent decades and these people will continue to alter their lifestyles in accordance with their understanding and speak up for nature and people.

However, it is easy to feel discouraged. It can help to read and understand what other people are doing.

NEW PARISH ELECTORAL ROLL

This year the Cathedral has to prepare an entirely new Electoral Roll. There is no automatic transfer of names for those who are on the existing roll. You will need to fill out a new application form if you wish your name to be included on the new roll.

Blank copies of the application form (green for the new roll) are available in the Cathedral, near the notice board in the South Transept. 
