The Dean's Introduction

Draw near!

With the Church of England across the nation, Draw Near is our theme for Lent this year. This isn't an assertive command but a humble, confident invitation to each one of us to draw nearer to God, to others in fellowship and exploration, and to ourselves.

This is a wonderful invitation to use Lent well. This season is associated with the forty days and nights Jesus spent withstanding the devil's temptations in the wilderness. Since the early centuries of the Church, this has been a time of preparation for those to be baptised and confirmed at Easter. It is a season for people of faith to reflect on their relationship with God, seeking to draw nearer to him so that they can enjoy life more fully. It provides an opportunity for those who are inquisitive about the Christian faith to explore without feeling any pressure to make a commitment.

The cathedral has a generous offering of opportunities - both for those who are searching and for Christians at different points along the pilgrimage of faith – choosing as much or as little as we find helpful.

We are all invited to draw near to Jesus through the liturgy, music and preaching of these days as He reveals the extent of God's life-transforming, hope-giving, indestructible love for His creation.

We are delighted that we will be led this Holy Week by the preaching of The Very Revd Jerry Lepine, former Dean of Bradford.

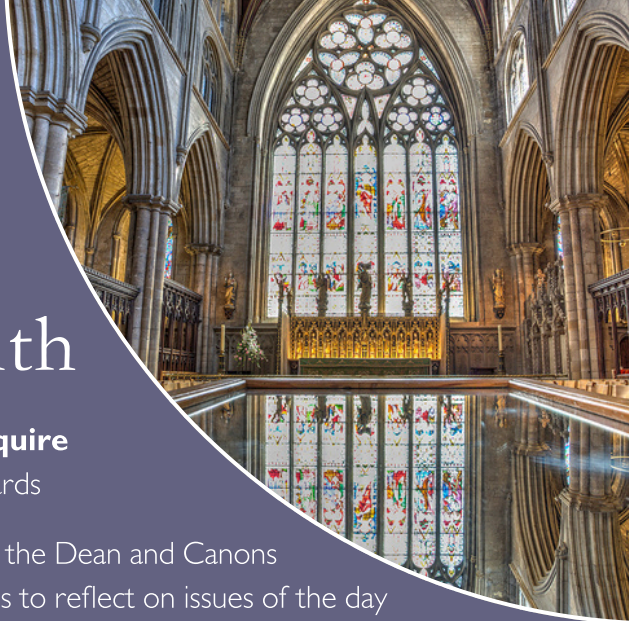

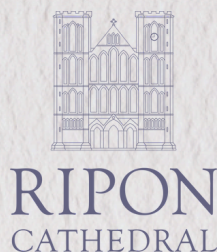
Dancing to the heartbeat of God
